HSPT

(Rising 7th and 8th grade)

HSPT- Math 1

June 29- July 3 9am- 12pm \$100

Rising 7th and 8th Graders. Ms. Rodda will provide math preparation to help students get ready for the High School Placement Test which will be administered in the fall for 8th grade students planning to attend Catholic High School as well as help students with their summer work. Class held 9am -12 noon daily. Students will use the HSPT book that is assigned as their summer homework.

HSPT- Language Arts 1

July 6-10 9am- 12pm \$100

Rising 7th and 8th Graders. Ms. Crosby will provide Language Arts preparation to help students get ready for the High School Placement Test which will be administered in the fall for 8th grade students planning to attend Catholic High School as well as help students with their summer work. Class held 9am -12 noon daily. Students will use the HSPT book that is assigned as their summer homework.

HSPT- Language Arts 2

July 27-31 9am- 12pm \$100

This a repeat of the first HSPT Language Arts course offered in early July. Ms. Crosby will provide Language Arts preparation to help students get ready for the High School Placement Test which will be administered in the fall for 8th grade students planning to attend Catholic High School as well as help students with their summer work. Class held 9am -12 noon daily. Students will use the HSPT book that is assigned as their summer homework.

HSPT- Math 2

August 3-7 9am- 12pm \$100

This is a repeat of the first HSPT Math course offered in June. Ms. Rodda will provide math preparation to help students get ready for the High School Placement Test which will be administered in the fall for 8th grade students planning to attend Catholic High School as well as help students with their summer work. Class held 9am -12 noon daily. Students will use the HSPT book that is assigned as their summer homework.

MATH

Middle School Math Enrichment (Rising 6th through 8th Grade)

June 29- August 7 \$150

Highly motivated students are encouraged to work with Ms. Rodda to continue with individualized math instruction right where you left off at the end of the year. Get ahead for next year. Students will use ALEKS to complete assignments. You will have twice a week check ins with Ms. Rodda to make sure you are on the right track and to ask questions. Students going into 6th Grade will need to take an assessment the first day of camp to determine what skills they need to work on.

Ms. Rodda will set up meeting times with families for a mutually agreed upon time throughout the course of the summer.

READING

Fonics Phun #1 (Incoming 1st- 3rd grade)

June 29- July 10 9:00-10:00 am \$75

Reinforce your phonics skills with Mrs. Gravell this summer. Review, practice letter/sound spellings, short vowel sounds, blending and segmenting CVC word patterns. One hour each day for a total of 10 sessions.

Fonics Phun #2 (Incoming 1st- 3rd grade)

June 29- July 10 10:00-11:00 am \$75

Take your phonics skills a little farther with Mrs. Gravell! Review long vowel patterns, vowel teams, controlled-r patterns, and consonant diagraphs. One hour each day for a total of 10 sessions.

Where are the Galapagos Islands? Book Club (Incoming 3rd- 5th grade)

June 29- July 10, 11:30am- 12:30pm \$75

Dive into nonfiction with Mrs. Gravell and explore the Galapagos for an hour each day for a total of 10 sessions. Printed materials will be available for pick-up the week before camp. Occasional access to a home printer may be needed.

Fellowship of the Rings Book Club (Incoming 6th to 8th grade)

June 29 – July 31 12:30pm- 1:30pm \$150

Come join Ms. Rodda as we experience the adventures of Frodo Baggins and his friends as they journey through Middle Earth. Book Club will meet daily to discuss the previous night's readings. Students will be expected to stay up with the reading and participate in the discussions. Books are provided to be borrowed and returned to school at the end of camp.

Journalism and Public Affairs Camp (Incoming 6th to 8th grade)

June 29 – July 10 9:30 am- 11:30 am \$150

This camp will give children an overview of the many facets of traditional journalism as well as modern communication practices. It will hone the children's writing and creativity skills with fun and interactive projects. Ms. Feroli's camp curriculum will include:

Conducting interviews - Writing for the internet -Taking photos, both candid and posed -Creating for professional social media accounts - Discovering other aspects of traditional and modern media based on the interests of the students.

Requirements: Access to digital camera or smartphone camera and ability to load and digitally share photos.

Drawing and Painting Beaches and Sea Life

Drawing and Collage

For all of my Art Camps on Zoom you will need: drawing pencils, eraser, blending stick, paper and colored pencils or crayons. This camp will also require different papers, paint, colored pencils, magazines, liquid glue and found items (sometimes when I am walking I find interesting items to put into my multimedia pieces). I have buttons and feathers that I have collected.
